Background information on the event (themes, issues, context).	Mayors are essential actors in delivering the New Urban Agenda's vision of prosperous, equitable, and low-carbon/resilient cities. They are strongly committed to addressing climate change, poverty and inequality in their cities, yet they are facing many challenges to deliver sustainable urban development, particularly acute financing challenges. Habitat III is an opportunity to overcome these difficulties. C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group (C40) and its partners are working together to support this goal through the C40 Cities Finance Facility, the Financing Sustainable Cities Initiative and a new Call for Action on Municipal Infrastructure Finance.

She also announced USAID's funding to the C40 Cities Finance Facility. Horacio Terraza's presentation explained what approaches, on top of support to the CFF, the IADB is pursing to help cities access international sources of finance, including multilateral development banks. Val Smith's presentation explained what are the objectives of the partnership between C40, the Citi Foundation and the World Resources Institute, and how Citi and the Citi Foundation support access to finance in cities across the world. Finally, Rodrigo Rosa's presentation addressed the major financing challenges that Rio de Janeiro is facing, and the steps that the city has taken to address these challenges. He also presented the Call for Action on Municipal Infrastructure Finance.
Recommendations that emerged from these discussions.	The recommendations are those contained in the Call for Action on Municipal Infrastructure Finance: - Development banks must be reformed to respond to city needs Cities must be granted direct access to international climate funds The power to control finance must be devolved to cities National governments must create a stable policy and regulatory environment Innovation, standardisation, pooling and pipelines must become the new normal Cities must be supported to develop their capacity to prepare and execute projects Financing climate action is vital to achieve the Paris Agreement and implement the New Urban Agenda.
