## — HABITAT III— SIDE EVENT REPORT

Concise summary of the event proceedings, including key points discussed	The round table organized by the World Union of Olympic Cities during the Habitat III Conference aimed at discussing the strategy planned and implemented after the Games to ensure a sustainable development for the city. The conference was opened by Mélanie Duparc, General Secretary of the World Union of Olympic Cities and Manager of the Smart Cities & Sport network and by Oscar Tosato, Executive Committee Member of the World Union of Olympic Cities and Vice Mayor in charge of Sport and Social Cohesion of the City of Lausanne. They were followed by the expert Kaara Martinez, Professor at Georgetown University who presented the general context as well as the risks and opportunities for a city regarding hosting mega sport events. Gabrielle Guimaraes, Senior Advisor for Multilateral Cooperation at the International Relations Department of the City of Rio de Janeiro presented how the Olympic Games have transformed the City and the long term strategy related to urban development of Rio. Finally, the city of Port Moresby, a non-Olympic City, and pilot city of the IOC's "Active Cities" initiative - co-led project by the IOC and its partner TAFISA, presented their programmes to promote health and to unite communities, underlying the importance and the value of the development of soft legacy for a sport city.
