This event brought together experts from academia and research, professional practice, NGOs and the grass roots to focus on participatory and collaborative approaches to design and planning education, research and professional practices that can support the implementation of the NUA and the SDGs.
Concise summary of the event proceedings, including key points discussed	Part 1 Introduction to session aim : the formation of a network for new approaches to design and planning education. Presentations: through concise presentations four speakers offered diverse examples of teaching and learning , methods , approaches and principles that we had used or experienced that could be useful in thinking about educating for the NUA and the SDGs. Part 2 Canvas audience opinion: did the audience think the NUA and SDGs were significant enough to be included in design and planning curricula? > Unanimous agreement. Part 3 Small groups discussed and fed back ideas for "What skills do urban professionals working in disadvantaged communities need if they are to foster inclusion and help build capacity, gender equity, etc? In other words, help implement the NUA and the SDGs" Part 4 Canvas audience opinion: did the audience want to be part of the Urban Change Makers Resource Network > Unanimous agreement.
