

MALAYSIA INTERVENTION REMARKS FOR THE THIRD SESSION OF THE PREPARATORY COMMITTEE (PREPCOM3) FOR THE UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE ON HOUSING AND SUSTAINABLE URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HABITAT III)

SURABAYA 25-27 JULY 2016

Thank you Mr Chairman,

Under-Secretary General and Executive Director Dr. Joan Clos, Honourable Guests, Distinguished Delegates, Ladies and Gentlemen

First and foremost, on behalf of the Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government of Malaysia, I would like to extend my heartiest congratulations on The Third Session of the Preparatory Committee (PrepCom3) for the United Nations Conference on Housing and Sustainable Urban Development (Habitat III). Malaysia is preparing of 2nd National Urbanisation Policy which aims to create a city of vision in line with the national vision in providing a safe and healthy living as well as peaceful and beautiful environment to promote socio-economic growth for a disciplined and developed Malaysian community.

Malaysia's commitments to ensuring environmental sustainability were implemented through the National Climate Change Policy, National Green Technology Policy and National Policy on Biodiversity to address issues of climate change and

sustainability of natural resources. Malaysia has introduced The Green Neighbourhood Planning Guidelines that take into consideration of the social, environment, application of green technology and wellbeing of the people.
