· Association of German Cities

The Association of German Cities was founded in Berlin 1905 and is the country's largest national federation of municipalities, comprising more than 3,400 cities and towns with about 51 million inhabitants. More than 200 cities are direct members, including all autonomous German cities such as the city-states of Berlin, Hamburg and Bremen. It has also twelve special members: regional groupings of local authorities, regional associations and professional associations. The Association of German Cities is the voice of cities and the national local-authority association of cities. As a community of solidarity of cities it represents the idea of local self-government to Federal Government, Federal States (Bundesländer), European Union, governmental and non-governmental organisations, international networks and the UN. The work and services of the Association of German Cities are primarily geared to the needs and interests of the direct member cities and their citizens.

UITP

UITP represents the local public transport community worldwide. Member organizations are public transport operators (from the public and private sectors), regulators (at local, regional and national level), and providers of goods and services for public transport. The focus of UITP is on urban and suburban passenger transport and all local transport modes are represented (bus, rail, taxi and shared mobility). With about 1,400 member organizations, in 350 cities, in 90 countries, UITP represents a large number of urban mobility players.
