

KEY MESSAGES and RECOMMENDATIONS




1. Promote people-centred cities

2. Target poverty alleviation


Safeguard and nurture culture-based livelihoods both traditional and contemporary



3. Foster safe and inclusive societies

Build on the diversity of culture and heritage to foster peace and intercultural dialogue, and counter urban violence





4. Develop sustainable built environments

Help create mixed-used inclusive public spaces to enhance liveability and to leverage culture and creativity for social cohesion and more inclusive participation in urban decision making



5. Encourage inclusive policies and urban governance

Improve urban governance by enabling and strengthening participation and engagement in decision-making processes
