<p><b>Concise summary of the app or technology promoted during the event</b></p>	<p>The "Compass" is a methodology applied in more than 25 cities with success, achieving tangible results in terms of influencing regulatory framework and public works through community organization and better coordination with local government planning approaches. The development of an APP has facilitated the spread of the methodology making it freely available and friendly to planners and community leaders equally. An step forward on this foundation has been the expansion of the APP to systematize the information created by the "Compass" and build up quick diagnosis and trends on migration and forced displacement flows taking into account multiple and complex factors of social, economic, political and environmental nature.</p>
